The Family Flair Mini-Mart has been in operation for the past 50 years!!

Yes, a real family affair. This business is owned and operated by the Radways and more specifically, Asbert Radway.

The original business name was 'Tom's Shop' as then, it was operated by his father Maas Tom. Maas Tom was a business man and as he took his coconuts to be sold in other parishes, he would return with other products for sale such as jippy-jappy hats, lamps etc. After awhile, he saw the need to formalize his business. Maas Tom, along with his wife who sold clothing, joined together and purchase a shop from someone who was going out of business



and they became the first black owners of business in that community.

Currently the business sells general food items and its focus is to serve the community. The major challenge that Family Flair Mini Mart experiences is that the business is located in a small community where not many persons work. The business is kept alive by passersby and this too may be affected because of deteriorating road conditions which makes the business slow at times. Nevertheless, Asbert Radway advices that "no matter how rough it gets, as a business person you have to hang in there and try to run the business like a business. You must put back money into the business and use only the mark-up portion as your own otherwise you will be in trouble." Family Flair Mini Mart is located at Bamboo Walk, Retreat, St. Mary.
